Form of Declaration for obtaining a Widow's Army Pension.

State of Connecticut
County of New Haven

On this 12th day of April A. D., one thousand eight hundred and sixty four, personally appeared before me Seuman H. Whedon Judge of Probate Court for the District of Madison Mary Jane Norton, a resident of Guilford in the county of New Haven and state of Connecticut, aged 33 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862: That she is the widow of Francis M. Norton, who was a Sergeant in company I commanded by Capt. Nichols in the 14th regiment of Connecticut Volunteers in the war of 1861, who on or about the 6th day of February 1864 at Mortars Road came to his death by reason of wounds received in action.

She further declares that she was married to the said Francis M. Norton on the 27th day of November in the year 1857; that her husband, the aforesaid Francis M. Norton died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period. She has five children Monroe L. 10 years old, Harry C. 8, Stephen B. 5 years old, William Jr. 2 years old

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. That her Post Office address is Madison. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States. I hereby appoint my attorney to prosecute this claim and receive the certificate for the same.

that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.



I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 49,685, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Francis W. Norton was enrolled on the 7th day of Aug., 1862, at New Haven in Co. "P", 14th Regiment of Conn. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 23rd day of August, 1862, at Hartford, Ct., in Co. "P", 14th Regiment of Conn. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "P" of that Regiment, for the months of Jan'y & Feby., 1864, ^{1st Regt. Francis W. Norton} he is reported Killed Feby. 6th at Norton's Ford.
