

B. Declaration for Widow's Army Pension.

State of Connecticut  
 County of New Haven

On this 29<sup>th</sup> day of August A. D. 1865, personally appeared before me, Judge of Probate of the District of Guilford in and for the County and State aforesaid, Jane S. Parmelle a resident of Guilford in the County of New Haven and State of Connecticut aged 49 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862, granting Pensions: That she is the widow of Joel C. Parmelle who was a private in Company C commanded by Capt. Addison C. Taylor in the Twenty Seventh Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers mustered into the service of the United States from the State of Connecticut in the war of 1861, and who ~~died~~ (or was killed) at the Battle of Fredericksburg Va.

on the thirteenth day of December 1862, as this deponent verily believes. She further declares that she was lawfully married to the said Joel C. Parmelle at New Haven in the State of Connecticut by Rev. Asa M. Train a Clergyman on the third day of June 1852; that her husband, the aforesaid Joel C. Parmelle died on the day above mentioned, as she verily believes, and she remained his faithful wife until his decease. She further declares that she has remained his widow ever since the death of her said husband, Joel C. Parmelle as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed.

She further declares that she had, by said deceased husband, five children now living, under the age of sixteen years, named, aged, and residing as follows:

and that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States, and that her maiden name was Jane S. Bunnell

and I hereby appoint DARIUS FORBES, General Claim Agent of the United States Sanitary Commission, or his successor in office, of Washington, D. C., my lawful attorney, to procure for me the Pension mentioned in the above application, and to receive and receipt for any Certificate which may issue in my favor in connection with the same, hereby ratifying and confirming whatever my said attorney may do in the premises. Davis and Henry Fowler residents of Guilford County of New Haven and State of Connecticut persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and saw Jane S. Parmelle sign her name (or make her mark) to the foregoing declaration; and they further swear that they have known the parties above described to have lived together as husband and wife for thirteen years previous to and up to the time of deceased going into the aforesaid service of the United States, and they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant, and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
