I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 49,185, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Francis M. Norton was enrolled on the 7th day of August, 1862, at New Haven, Conn Co. "I", 14th Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a private on the 23d day of August 1862, at Hartford, Conn., in Co. "I", 14th Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "Return" of that Regiment, for the months of February, 1864, he is reported a 1st Sergeant "Killed in action" at Norton's Ford, Va. Feby. 1<sup>st</sup> 1864."




